Box: 14M users, 140K businesses (as of Jan 2013)

Dropbox: 100M users (as of Nov 2012)

Google: 425 Million Gmail Users / 5 Million Businesses (as of June 2012)

iCloud: 250M users (January 2013)

Evernote: 35 M users, 1.4 M paid users (July 2012)

Salesforce: Can't find solid / backed up newer numbers, but saw one article that estimated 4.9M users and 140K companies based on financial reports.

Sharepoint: Can't find solid / backed up updated numbers, other than adding the 125M users are across 65K companies.
